

NCLGA Unveils New Strategic Plan

PRINCE GEORGE (April 5, 2019) - The North Central Local Government Association (NCLGA) has announced a new Strategic Plan to set its course for the next four years.

The 2019-2022 strategic plan identifies priorities, goals and actions that NCLGA will take as the voice of northern communities. The NCLGA is an elected body representing all local governments in north and central British Columbia. The association works toward ensuring social, economic, and environmental well-being for all member communities in the region – which encompass nearly 70% of the province’s land base.

The NCLGA has four strategic goals:

1. To ensure advocacy by providing member input into informed decision-making
2. To communicate effectively and share important information and strategies through various tools and resources
3. To build productive and positive relationships with members, partners, other orders of government, the private sector and civil society
4. To maintain resiliency by operating a transparent and sustainable organization

“This new Strategic Plan is a direct result of valuable input from our members”, says NCLGA president, Gord Klassen. “It provides us with clear direction for our work over the next several years. By effectively carrying out this Strategic Plan, we will deliver support and benefits to our members, and we’ll continue to be a strong advocate for the people of north central BC.”
