Over three hundred mayors, councillors, regional directors, First Nations representatives and industry stakeholders will meet this week at the North Central Local Government Association's 60th AGM and Convention in Prince George, BC. From senior cabinet ministers to opposition critics; First Nations chiefs to Mayors from across 70% of the province; the head of BC's largest economic development agency to the leader of Canada's biggest Native Friendship Center; delegates will hear about the changes, challenges and opportunities they will face in the near and distant future. Resolutions to be debated touch on rape culture, human trafficking, rail transportation safety, changes made to the Agricultural Land Reserve, and more.
